


When purchasing shoes, please ensure your child is present so the shoes can be properly fitted. Children should be able to put their shoes on independently without assistance.





Why it's important to read with children

Reading to your child helps build strong language and early literacy skills. It supports listening, imagination, expressive language and social-emotional development while preparing children for school. Daily reading also creates positive learning routines and a lifelong love for books.

Tips for Reading With Your Child

- Read every day, even if it's just for 5–10 minutes
- Let your child choose the book to keep them interested
- Ask simple questions and talk about the pictures
- Use different voices and expressions to make the story fun
- Encourage your child to turn pages and repeat words
- Re-read favourite books to build confidence and understanding
